It states that many studies with strong research designs conducted throughout the world unanimously conclude that women who have abortions do not have a risk of developing breast cancer. These conclusions are supported by the World Health Organisation, the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists and the U.S. National Cancer Institute. At first glance that is an impressive lineup. But Dr Joel Brind PhD, an epidemiologist from New York, points out that 57 studies since 1957 show a link as opposed to 15 that don't.

More recently, 36 studies from mainland China reveal the link between abortion and breast cancer, which is believed to be associated with widespread abortion resulting from the "One-Child" policy.
