

## PROLIFE FACTS

Back in August, the Auckland University Students' Association (AUSA) announced that they had received a complaint about the campus Pro-Life Club and would conduct an online referendum on whether the Club should be disaffiliated from the association. AUSA refused to reveal the nature of the complaint or who laid the complaint. This was the third attempt to disaffiliate the Club and when 60% of the 2,700 students who responded voted in favour, the Club's prospects looked grim. Well-known blog sites like WhaleOil and Kiwiblog described AUSA's referendum as "fascist" and "totalitarian" – and the majority of bloggers seemed to agree that university is a setting where freedom of thought and speech should be accepted.

Before they could proceed with the Pro-Life Club's disaffiliation, AUSA took legal advice and after some delay, their lawyers have recently advised that the wording of the referendum is misleading and therefore the result is "null and void". It's back to the drawing board for AUSA, a moral victory for the Pro-Life Club and meanwhile, this incident has served to raise awareness of the Pro-life group and what they stand for amongst students at the University of Auckland. However, it is to be hoped that in future AUSA will avoid actions that put minority groups of students at risk of suffering exclusion or discrimination on the basis of their views.
