

ALL FOR LIFE CONFERENCE SPEAKERS

Sister Miriam Duggan



Sister Miriam Duggan M.B.Ch., F.R.C.O.G., Obstetrician, Congregation Leader, Franciscan Missionary Sisters for Africa. Sister Miriam will speak on her experience in reducing HIV and AIDS in Uganda, where she worked as a Medical Superintendent of Nsambya Hospital, Kampala. Using a collaborative approach

with Government and other church groups, they introduced a program called Youth Alive. Dramatic drops in HIV rates were seen using the program which promoted a positive peer culture among teens building self esteem, encouraging avoidance of drug and alcohol abuse, empowering them to abstain from premarital sex, and promoting faithfulness in marriage rather than relying on the use of condoms as in other African States. The HIV rates among pregnant women dropped from a high of 28%, to current levels of approximately 6.9%.


Dr. Ate Moala

She is founder of Purely Girls Camp – a teenage girls' camp to celebrate girls' purity and equip girls with tools so they can have success in ALL of life. She is involved in Pacific health

teaching, research and health development. She works alongside her husband as a clinical manager of Pacific Orthopaedics – a specialist orthopaedic and spine surgery practice. She is a board member of the New Zealand Guidelines Group. She is Focus on the Family NZ's Resident Physician. Ate is passionate about building healthy and strong families. She lives with her husband Mark and their 3 children in Wellington.

Dr. Joseph Hassan and Cushla Hassan



Dr Joseph Hassan MBChB, DCH, Dip Obst., MRCGP, FRNZCGP & Cushla Hassan BN. Joseph is a GP in Nelson working in a Christian Health Centre. Joseph, and Cushla a nurse, have four children. They have some experience in setting up a Crisis Pregnancy Service to offer women positive alternatives to abortion.

Together with others they have built a team of professional and lay volunteers who work in a co-ordinated fashion, linking with other support agencies to provide a network of support to women faced with this situation. They will speak about their experience gained so far, and the encouraging results seen in the Nelson region. Cushla is also a Trustee on the 'Life Thrust Trust' based in Wellington. This trust provides financial assistance to help a women in a crisis pregnancy who wishes to continue her pregnancy with support.

Dr Peter Scanlon MBChB, BHB, BSc, PG Dip CEM, FAMPA, Accident & Medical Practitioner. Peter is married to Maria and they have six children. He works at a private Accident & Medical Clinic in Hamilton and will speak on the way we teach healthy sexuality to our teens and why contraceptive use in this age

group may have long-term ramifications and possible multi-generational adverse health effects. Are we on the wrong track following the Family Planning approach of promoting birth control with the back up of "the morning after pill," early treatment of STI's and abortion, when we could be encouraging "best practice" amongst our young people and aiming for the goals of fulfilling long-term stable relationships and families?
